# **Chosen Name and Pronouns**

### What are chosen names?

The name a person should be known as. May be different than their legal name.

#### What are pronouns?

Words used to refer to someone in place of their name.

# Why is using the correct name and pronouns important?

It communicates respect. It shows the person that they belong. It allows you to properly connect.

## How should I use these?

Use someone's chosen name if you know it - especially if different than legal name. Use someone's correct pronouns if you know them when referring to them.

> "Graham had that class and they probably still have the book." "Ken said he loved that restaurant!"

If you don't know someone's pronouns, you may

- offer yours up first, ask and allow everyone to share theirs but not force it

"Hey, my name is Erica. I use she/her. How about you?"

- use gender neutral ones like they/them

- use their name

Apologize, correct yourself, and move on if you make a mistake. Practice correct pronouns for future interactions.

## Common third person pronouns include:

He/Him

She/Her

They/them

\*Please note that there are more pronouns than those listed above and that people may use multiple.
